
Federal Funding for Education Data

State leaders can use various federal funding streams to support state data systems or related data activities. These federal funding streams are flexible, specify data as an allowable activity, or are allocated specifically for data.

In the pages that follow, we've identified the amount of funding most likely to be used for these purposes where possible. Otherwise, the total appropriation figure is included. For grants that have funds that can be used flexibly or include data as an allowable activity, the choice to prioritize state data systems or related activities using these funding streams is at the grantee's discretion. These figures represent primarily state-level funding; additional funds flow to local entities that in many cases could be used for local data activities.






